

Perfecto de Indicativo * Present Perfect

What have you done? Where have you gone? Or *¿Qué has hecho? ¿Adónde has ido?*

An easy ride because it almost translates directly from English, remember to use the helping verbs *he, has, ha, hemos, habéis, han*.

This frequently used *compound past tense* describes an action in the past that doesn't have a definite time frame. It is used to describe most actions in the past that don't require a subjunctive or conditional modal.

1. **No lo he visto.** *I have not seen it.*
2. **Han escrito los reportajes.** *They have written the reports.*

he hablado <i>I have spoken</i>	hemos hablado <i>We have spoken.</i>
has hablado <i>You have spoken.</i>	habéis hablado <i>you all have spoken</i>
ha hablado <i>He has spoken.</i>	han hablado <i>They have spoken.</i>

Past Participles

-AR Verbs = -ADO. *estudiado, bailado, practicado*

-ER Verbs = -IDO *bebido, comido, aprendido*

-IR Verbs = -IDO *vivido, asistido, deprimido*

Preguntas Personales

¿Adónde has ido? He ido al supermercado.

¿Cuándo has comido? He comido a la una.

¿Has estudiado algo? He estudiado mucho.

¿Han aprendido en la clase? No, no he aprendido en la clase.
